Course Aim(s) :

The workshop is designed to provide participants with both the knowledge and skills to apply animal welfare best-practice within their own institutions; aiming to develop a holistic approach to continued animal welfare progression. Developed for all staff involved in the animal management industry, participants will improve their understanding of how to efficiently and effectively enhance the welfare of the animals in their care.

Learning Outcomes:

By the end of this workshop you will:

- Understand animal welfare as a scientific discipline.
- Be able to identify the factors effecting animal welfare and recognise their influence on the lives of animals in our care.
- Be able to identify and problem solve to meet animals' motivations.
- Be able to confidently and competently conduct an animal welfare assessment and problem solve to improve the welfare.

Content:

- What is animal welfare?
- Holistic understanding of welfare: Psychological, physiological and Behavioural
- How does the zoo visitor affect your animals' welfare?
- Conducting animal welfare assessments
- Problem solving to improve welfare
- Addressing animal motivations
- Environmental enrichment

Assessment:

- Completion of an animal welfare assessment during the workshop.
- Design, make and apply welfare interventions to a species within the zoo during the workshop.

These will both be conducted as informal assessments.

Additional information:

All resources, including practical materials, lunch and refreshments will be provided across all four days.

The workshop will contain both practical and theory elements; including discussions, group work, research tasks and practical work within animal enclosures.

The workshop is delivered across four full days. You must attend all sessions to complete the course.

Practical materials and equipment will be provided, but please bring suitable clothing and footwear for working in an animal enclosure.
