NATIONAL PARK PLITVICE LAKES

Plitvice lakes national park is one of the most visited tourist attractions in this part of Europe. Plitvice lakes has been a national park since 1949 and in 1979 it was added to the UNESCO list of world natural heritage.



RASTOKE (SLUNJ)

Rastoke is the historic center of the Croatian municipality of Slunj known for its well-preserved mills and little waterfalls along the Slunjčica river. Therefore often being referred to as “the Small Lakes of Plitvice”. In contrast to the Lakes, Rastoke features a three hundred-year old village with houses and watermills.
